



# MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



Here we go again, about to turn another seasonal corner. By the time that you read this the trees will be more bare than bushy. Beyond that, we will bundle up and celebrate the holidays.

With the change of season we cease doing most of our outdoor work. Trackwork, painting and grounds keeping all stop. Inside, some of the display materials from the middle section will have to be stored for the winter. The Museum will be open on the first Saturday of the month through the winter.

We'll be gathering up things to go to the WNYRHS train show at the fairgrounds, November 22nd and 23rd. Help in loading, hauling and setting up and

taking down is always appreciated. After the show, there are Holiday decorations to be put up for Winterwalk. We have asked to have the pony rides and have invited Mr. Claus to operate out of the Museum.

The long awaited art installation on the museum property is now ready to happen. The contractor has the site prepared. The artwork is still in fabrication and installation will come later, probably in the spring. We have acquired a "milkhouse heater" to be installed in EL-2. This will mitigate the freeze and thaw cycle that is harmful to the brickwork.

In December, we will be participating in Winterwalk again. The hours are later this year, 11am and running till 7pm. This is to accommodate a tree lighting ceremony at 6 pm.

Looking farther ahead, Anton reports that there is another Historic Marker in the works. This one will be for the Erie station in Gowanda. The station is owned by Cattaraugus County Industrial Development Agency (IDA) and Anton is working with the Gowanda Village Historian. More on that when we get closer.

The 2026 Chapter Calendar is out and is for sale. You can get it at the museum, by mail, at the monthly meeting or at select retail outlets and at the Hamburg WNYRHS Train Show at the Chapter's table. They make a great holiday gift!

From time-to-time opportunities present themselves to acquire things that we can use. Such an opportunity occurred this month. Steve and Ben found a crane. Sitting forlornly in the weeds, this 1980 vintage FMC Linkbelt rubber-tired machine was acquired by us. It's not pretty but it's mechanically sound. The crew borrowed the battery out of the Tonawanda Island engine and it started right up. Arrangements were made to transport it to the museum. When spring comes, it will greatly enhance the prime mover swap in the Tonawanda Island locomotive. When we get to constructing switches, it will be very handy again.





# SCENE ON THE LINE - A STOP ON THE PEANUT .... A LONG TIME AGO



With its huge oil headlight, a link & pin coupler on the cowcatcher pilot and a balloon stack / spark arrestor suggesting a wood burning firebox, a vintage 4-4-0 American type engine has drifted to a stop at the Clarence Center, NY station on New York Central's bucolic Canandaigua & Niagara Falls branch, locally known as "the Peanut" probably in the early 1870s. The boxcar on the left is lettered NYC & HR RR, so that helps us to date the picture. (New York Central was merged with the Hudson River RR November 1, 1869.) The train is westbound so its likely termination point is Suspension Bridge in Niagara Falls. With the sunlight coming from the east, we can be certain this is a morning train. *Both photos: Bob Andrycha collection*.

# THE WEST SHORE RR IN CLARENCE & AKRON ..... A LONG TIME AGO



Bob Andrycha also submitted the following interesting newsclip in the May 16, 1892 edition of the Buffalo Evening News, page 17.

"Clarence: The West Shore railway is laying pipe to convey water from Millpond, three-quarters of a mile west of Clarence Station, to supply water for passenger and freight trains. Water engines and tubs will be removed from Akron to Millpond and Clarence. The water will be forced from the pond by steam pumps."




Does anyone have a photo of the pump house? The pumps would of necessity had to have an enclosure and would have been protected from winter freezes. This also means there would have been personnel assigned to stoke the boiler. Was it a round the clock operation?

# **STATION NEWS**


